How many different ways can you make 13? Use pasta, smarties, and buttons – anything you can find at home and get an adult to draw this in your book.


Look at the video and let's get sharing.



Practical ideas

Here are some practical ideas you could try. Some of them could be linked to our topic, but some of them might be linked other areas of learning.

Take your favourite teddy bear on a walk with you. Can you take some pictures of him hiding in different places? Can you use positional language to describe where he is? e.g. above, behind, between, beneath, beside. Can you draw a picture of your teddy in different places in your red book?



Can you make some teddy bear toast? What ingredients did you use? How did you make them? Can you give someone else in your house instructions on how to make them? What did they taste like?



Using toilet roll tubes, can you make the characters from the Goldilocks story? Can you make the bears different sizes? Can you use them to act out the story?



When Goldilocks sat on the chairs, Daddy Bear's chair was too hard and Mummy Bear's chair was too soft. Can you find lots of other hard and soft objects from around the house and sort them?



Collect lots of different objects from around the garden, your house or on a walk and use string to make a wind catcher/mobile. What sound does it make in the wind?



Have a teddy bear's picnic in the garden. Can you make some invitations for the bears? Can you share out the snacks fairly between them?
