



'Round the apple and down the leaf' to help write it perfectly.




Help your child make a list of things they find in their house that begin with the sound 'a'



## Practical ideas

Here are some practical learning ideas you could try.  
Some of them could be linked to our topic, but some of them might be linked to other areas of learning.



You could make some sensory bottles, add glitter, food colouring or beads to make them extra special.

### Memory game



Make a collection, cover with a cloth.  
Remove an item, what's missing?

We have played the 'memory game' lots in nursery and the children are really good at it. Ask your child to count how many items are on your tray and then how many are left when one is missing.



You try sorting coins by their shape and colour. Help your child to count how many there are of each one.
