Phonics and Reading



This week we have begun teaching daily phonics sessions with the children. We follow the Little Wandle Phonics programme and in a few weeks' time, we will begin small group reading sessions 3 times per week with the children. Following these sessions, the children will take home the book they have been reading in class to continue practising at home to help build their confidence and fluency when reading independently.

Please can we ensure that each time you read with your child, you comment and sign in their reading diaries. It is important that the books are returned to school each week on a **Monday**. If any books are lost or damaged, there is a £5 charge.

Please feel free to come and talk to us about your child's reading at any time. You can really help by building their comprehension skills by asking questions about the book.
